

Then, on the fourth day, we joined forces with Te Arawa Catfish Killas to help pull up their nets and learn about the invasive species in our lakes. We gained insights into how we can all contribute to prevention efforts and learned a lot about our taioa.

We also took a hikoi near Okere Falls by the trout pools, immersing ourselves in the beauty of nature. To cap off our adventurous week, we embarked on the Rotorua Duck Tours to explore our backyard and, true to form, got a bit wet in the process!

SCION - SCIENCE AND RESEARCH

Our students had an incredible day at SCION - Science and Research, diving into the world of trees and disease prevention with the E Heke e Heka app!

We spent the day exploring the fascinating world of our native trees like Pohutukawa, Ramarama, Manuka, Kanuka, Rata, and Swamp Maire, alongside exotic trees such as feijoa, guava, and eucalyptus. We learned firsthand about the impact of Myrtle Rust and how it threatens these beautiful trees.

In the labs, we got hands-on with scientists who showed us insects, plants, and slides illustrating the effects of Myrtle Rust. Our students were thrilled to use the app to learn more about this disease and how they can contribute to protecting our forests.
